

THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

"Brothers and sisters: I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'... For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes."

Do you know that these words of Saint Paul were written before the gospel account of the last supper? Paul handed on what was already the 'tradition' of the earliest Christian communities. I need to remember that Jesus gave me this holy sacrament to make me holy, to sustain me on my faith journey and allow me to grow in union with Him. It is the Eucharist which makes us who we are. I ask that I be worthy to receive such a great gift.

I am summoned by the Lord. I need to be fed with this gift which has been reserved and given for me. My faith asks me to meet the Lord in word and sacrament, as I do each Sunday. I ask that this gift not be received as routine but a new meeting with my Savior, my special moment to go 'one on one' with Him.
