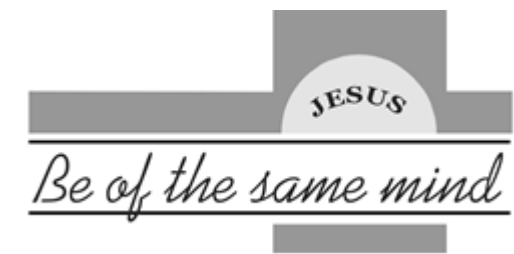

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, who though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness, and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.”

How beautiful the teaching of Saint Paul calling us to be like Jesus. Reread these powerful words. Remember, this is God wishing to join us, the human race, while still remaining God, because of His love, wanting to save and rescue us. He came because of our need.

We often hear the expression, ‘you have an attitude’, usually reflecting a negative judgment. Not so today, as Paul is encouraging us to assume our oneness with Jesus, giving of ourselves, as He who emptied, poured out everything for us and our salvation.
